On the fifth Sunday of Lent, we remember St. Mary of Egypt, a powerful example of repentance and God's mercy. As a young woman, she led a sinful life, but when she attempted to enter a church in Jerusalem, an invisible force held her back. She realized that her sins were keeping her from God. Praying before an icon of the Theotokos, she sought assistance and was finally able to enter. From that moment on, she left her old life behind and dedicated the rest of her years to the desert, praying and deepening her relationship with God
