

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" (John 12:13). This joyful event occurred just before the start of Holy Week, when Jesus would suffer, die, and rise again for our salvation.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Palm Sunday reminds us that Jesus is our King, not of an earthly kingdom, but of Heaven. The people welcomed Him with joy, yet later, many turned away. We are called to remain faithful to Jesus, not just on joyful days, but always—even when times are tough.

DO YOU KNOW HOW WE CAN APPLY THIS TODAY?

We can welcome Jesus into our hearts just as the people welcomed Him into Jerusalem—through prayer, acts of love, and preparing for Holy Week with faith and devotion.

For Children

- Bring a palm branch to church and hold it during the procession, keeping in mind that you are welcoming Jesus into your heart.
- Say 'Hosanna!' in prayer this week, thanking Jesus for His love and sacrifice.

FOR PARENTS

- Read the story of Palm Sunday together (John 12:12-19) and discuss what it truly means to welcome Jesus into our lives.
- Prepare for Holy Week as a family by attending services, praying together, and planning how to focus on Christ's journey to the Cross and Resurrection.
