May 25, 2025 Sunday of the Blind Man

Epistle Reading: Acts 16:16-34 Gospel Reading: John 9:1-38

Liturgical Message

On the Sixth Sunday after Pascha, the Church proclaims the Gospel of the healing of the blind man (John 9:1-38). This miracle shows us that Christ is not only the Light of the world but also the One who gives us the ability to see with our eyes and hearts truly. The man who was born without sight receives not only physical healing but spiritual vision. He recognizes Christ as the Son of God and worships Him.

The Gospel also shows the blindness of the Pharisees—those who could physically see, but were spiritually blind. They refused to believe, even when the truth stood before them. This reminds us that spiritual blindness is worse than physical blindness. When pride, fear, or sin darken our hearts, we cannot see Christ.

Today, we are invited to ask Christ to heal our inner blindness. Only through Him can we see the truth, walk in the light, and recognize God's presence in our lives. Let us, like the blind man, dare to believe, to speak the truth, and to follow the Light wherever it leads.

The Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ



The Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ is celebrated on the 40th day after Pascha (Easter) and marks the moment Christ was taken up into heaven in glory (Acts 1:9-11). It is one of the Twelve Great Feasts of

the Orthodox Church and a vital part of our salvation story. With His Ascension, Christ completes His earthly mission and returns to the Father's right hand, lifting our human nature with Him and opening the way to heaven for all who believe.

The Ascension is not just about Christ going away but about Christ being exalted. He does not abandon us. On the contrary, He promises: "I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). By ascending in His glorified body, He glorifies our human nature and shows us that our true home is in heaven. From His heavenly throne, He intercedes for us and prepares a place for us in His Kingdom.

The angels told the apostles, "This same Jesus... will come in the same way you saw Him go into heaven" (Acts 1:11). The Ascension strengthens our hope in Christ's Second Coming and reminds us to live not for this world, but for the Kingdom to come. It also points to the coming of the Holy Spirit, which we prepare to celebrate on Pentecost. As the Church sings, "Thou didst ascend in glory, O Christ our God, and didst gladden Thy disciples with the promise of the Holy Spirit."
